

It is world book day on Thursday 2nd March and all of our children will get to meet a real-life author, Matt Flukes. He is going to read his book to the children and if you have ordered one of his books he will sign it for your child. Children can come to school wearing pajamas or lounge wear and bring their favourite book to school with them to share with their friends.

We break up for half term on Friday 17th February, in the first week back we have an INSET day on Monday 27th, the children return to school on Tuesday 28th, this is the next proposed date for industrial action by members of the NEU teaching union. The following letter will be emailed to all parents today.

Industrial Action by Members of NEU

Dear Parents and Carers,

Following my correspondence in January I am now in a position to give you more information about the proposed arrangements in school for **Tuesday 28th February.**

Please be mindful that arrangements could change at the very last moment as colleagues do have the right to change their plans or wait until the day of action, before deciding whether to take action or not.

I can confirm that a considerable amount of time has been taken to ascertain whether it is safe to open school; a full plan and risk assessment has been co-produced by myself and the school's Chair of the Governing Board.

We have worked together to consider the impact that the action will have on the health and safety of our pupils, staff and visitors and whether the school can run a full or amended curriculum. I am

sure you will appreciate that a key issue is centred around having enough staff available for the school to remain open.

It is also important to consider the impact of other school decisions on our remaining staff who may have to consider childcare arrangements for themselves. In short, the decision to make any form of closure; part or full, is a difficult and complex one and staff absence on the day of action should not be interpreted as members of staff taking strike action.

After considering the staffing options and the health and safety implications we have decided that school will be:

Open to all pupils in EYFS, Mrs Goodwin's class; Year 1, Miss Woodworth's class; Year 2, Miss Nugent's class; Resource, Mrs Parker's class; Year 4 Miss Brownrigg's class and Year 6 Mrs Davies' class

Open to pupils who are in receipt of Free School meal funding, vulnerable children and children who are looked after by the Local Authority in Year 3 Mrs Burke's class and Year 5 Mr Fenwick's class. Please note that where classes are not fully in school the curriculum will be amended – this is so that pupils who are not in school will not be disadvantaged by missing important lessons planned by qualified teachers.

We will contact all families in Year 3 and Year 5 to confirm school attendance, this is so that you are absolutely clear about whether your child is in school or not.

Breakfast and after school club will run as usual for those children in school.

If our plans change and we have to close more of the school we will let you know as soon as we can, but this may be the morning of Tuesday 28th February, so please check your emails, class dojo and the school website.

I know that this arrangement will prove to be disruptive to many of our families and any day lost in school is one that has impact for our children. A national strike within the teaching community is unusual and taking such action is never an easy decision to make. Please remember that this response from colleagues is a reaction to the national issues around teacher pay and conditions and the shortfall in essential funding for all of our children. We are grateful that teachers have let us know their intentions in advance, as they are not required to do so until the day itself. This enabled us to plan and inform you accordingly.

I will write to you again with regard to arrangements on each of the strike days that have been identified for our region. The next dates scheduled are March 15th and 16th. I will be assessing the impact of staff decisions on each of these dates separately.

Thank you for your patience and understanding in this matter.
